SUPERIOR WALLS PROVIDES FOUNDATION FOR HISTORIC FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT HOUSE

Superior Walls was approached by Polymath Park Resort, in Acme (Westmoreland County), PA, regarding donation of a foundation for the Duncan House, a 1957 Usonian home designed by world-renowned architect, Frank Lloyd Wright.



The house had been dismantled from its original location in Lisle, IL, and moved to Johnstown, PA awaiting reconstruction as a guest home for visitors to the Park. The Park already contains two homes [Balter House and Blum House] designed by Wright's apprentice, Peter Bernston.



"Groundbreaking" took place in June and the Superior Walls foundation was set in August. The Park is expected to open this fall.
